For third and fourth year students, an internship gives them an opportunity to further their knowledge and skills in an applied setting, while earning academic credit.

## EXPECTATIONS

Employers commit to providing a learning experience relevant to the student's area of study and career development. Responsibilities of the employer supervisor include:

- Provide an *Internship Work Proposal*
- Sign the *Internship Agreement*
- Meet with the faculty supervisor
- Initiate the orientation process
- Prepare weekly learning activities
- Identify opportunities for the student to develop core competencies
- Offer guidance, mentoring, and feedback
- Schedule regular meetings with the student
- Review the student's progress
- Complete and submit the evaluation to the faculty supervisor
