Students receive relevant work experience while you, the employer/community partner, benefit from their fresh perspectives.

Students in the Kinesiology/Physical Education program challenge themselves to understand human mobility in all its complexity and learn about movement in the context of physiology, anatomy, psychology, sociology, biomechanics, lifestyle, and behaviour. Their studies take them into the field of health, through clinical practice, spanning disease prevention, to sport and coaching. Their experience is acquired in fully-equipped metabolic, neuromuscular, biomechanical, and psychomotor labs, making them “job ready” upon graduation. They are thoroughly prepared for the College of Kinesiologists of Ontario (CKO) certification. For third and fourth year students, an internship gives them an opportunity to further their knowledge and skills in an applied setting, while earning academic credit. Kinesiology is offered as an honours major in the Bachelor of Science degree program, as well as an honours major in the Bachelor of Arts degree program. Physical Education is a Bachelor of Arts degree program within the Kinesiology and Physical Education Department.

EXPECTATIONS

Employers commit to providing a learning experience relevant to the student’s area of study and career development. Responsibilities of the employer supervisor include:

- Provide an *Internship Work Proposal*
- Sign the *Internship Agreement*
- Meet with the faculty supervisor
- Initiate the orientation process
- Prepare weekly learning activities
- Identify opportunities for the student to develop core competencies
- Offer guidance, mentoring, and feedback
- Schedule regular meetings with the student
- Review the student’s progress
- Complete and submit the evaluation to the faculty supervisor
