International prospective students of Redeemer University:

All international students are required to provide official high school and post-secondary records, along with appropriate education certificates/diplomas directly from the institution(s) attended.

If having your records and/or documents send directly from your high school is not possible, we will instead require:

- Documentation must be notarized with a letter stating the documentation is official and not tampered with; including the notary's signature and seal
- The notary must scan copies of the transcripts (front and back) to be sent along with the letter
- The notary must send the notarized documents to admissions@redeemer.ca
- If the transcript is not in English, it must be translated and notarized as well

All post-secondary records for international students applying to Redeemer will need to be verified by World Education Services (www.wes.org).

If a prospective student is not able to provide Redeemer University with the documentation as described above, this student will not be considered for admission.
