Redeemer & COVID-19

Transitions

Helpful information for you during your student's transition to university

For most people, going to university is a milestone, both for the individual and for the family. Not only will your student enter a new environment, but relationships at home will change as well.

This is often the first time that students are making decisions without the immediate counsel and support of their parents. The involvement of Redeemer staff in your student's life will be different from that of a parent, even though we may share many common interests and goals.

School is a Full Time Job

One of the major challenges faced by most university students is the development of self-discipline regarding their use of time. We suggest you encourage your student to view university as a "full-time job." The adjustments that occur and the habits that are established during the first year at university often serve as a springboard for future educational and life situations.

Stay Connected to School News

Throughout the year, Redeemer reminds the student body about upcoming events, policies, procedures, and deadlines (such as housing deposits, key returns, academic deadlines and so forth) through the Redeemer App. Your student is encouraged to take the time to read these regular updates. The Redeemer App can be accessed online or through the downloadable

app to their devices. As a parent, you can also stay updated on deadlines and events through our [parent eNews](#). Information for signing up for the parent eNews is listed at the end of this handbook.

Adjusting to University can be Difficult

Just as most jobs have their high and low points, going to university also has its moments of success and moments of challenge. This will become apparent to you in the messages and phone calls you receive from your student throughout the year. Encourage them to keep an open mind and an optimistic outlook towards university. It is often the case that nothing warms the heart more than the memory of home via letters, phone calls, baked goods or other surprises to help maintain contact. These years of university can be a unique opportunity for you to develop a stronger friendship with your student.

Learning to Make Good Choices

The university years provide an opportunity for students to develop autonomy and grow in their decision making skills. Life at a small Christian university will remove many of life's temptations from the university experience. Through policy, expectations and example, Redeemer University seeks to guide students to develop healthy, Christian attitudes and appropriate social behaviour. Occasionally, however, we meet with students who have broken a campus policy. We attempt to provide appropriate supervision of student life on campus, as well as guidance and accountability when policies are broken.

Talking about Expectations

We encourage you to find time over the next few weeks to discuss your hopes and your expectations with your student while they attend Redeemer. In turn, we hope we will have the opportunity to get to know your student well enough so that we can give guidance, encouragement and insight necessary for a healthy university experience.

Journeying Together

What follows is additional information you may find helpful. During the course of the upcoming school year, we hope you'll find time to give us the opportunity to become better acquainted with you. We think Redeemer University is a great place, made available to us by the grace of the Lord, and we want very much to have your family share that view with us in the weeks ahead.

Questions or Concerns

You may have specific concerns about your student's social, physical, spiritual, or academic well-being. It is recommended that you discuss these concerns with your student and encourage them to connect with the relevant Redeemer staff.

You may contact Redeemer's Student Life staff if further interaction would be helpful. We can listen to your concerns and discuss possible options for assisting your student. Please note that due to the fact that most of our students are over 18, we cannot comment on specifics about your student's situation, but we can also let you know about what resources and supports are available and determine the right person to connect you with.

Frequently Asked Questions

As parents, we know you might have a number of questions about your child participating in university life. The [2022/23 Academic Calendar](#) is a great resource for relevant policies and procedures for academics, fees, housing, payment, refunds, policy on life and conduct, grievances and many other important matters.

To assist you, we have identified a few FAQs that you might find helpful.

Student Life

How can students find out about Orientation and the Check-In process?

Your student will have received information pertaining to the LAUNCH orientation program and residence life in the [Redeemer App](#) or at the [LAUNCH website](#).

What about Personal Property Insurance?

Redeemer's property insurance does not cover student losses of personal property as a result of fire, flood or theft. Students are asked to put proper identification on things such as bikes, computers, electronics, televisions, etc. Please check with your insurance company to see if your student's belongings are insured at Redeemer. If not, you may wish to insure your student's personal property.

What about the adjustment to living in residence?

For students who are living in residence, becoming accustomed to residence living may be one of the most difficult adjustments your student will have to make. With some effort it can be done successfully. At times, it can be difficult to balance individual needs with what is best for the overall group. We've found that there are certain times of the year when living with others can be more stressful than others, and we seek to use that time to walk students through managing stress and working through conflict. Even though it is not always easy, we consider ourselves to be extremely privileged to have our townhouses and small living groups.

Where can I find information about the Meal Plan?

Meal plan information can be found on the Redeemer App. Students with allergies and dietary requirements are encouraged to contact Campus Services (campusservices@redeemer.ca) so any concerns can be addressed.

How Safe is the Campus?

You can be confident that our campus is a safe and secure environment in which to live, work and learn. The Redeemer Security Team provides 24/7 security of the campus and emergency response to medical and other emergencies. If a student needs to make an emergency call, it is recommended that individuals call both 911 and the Redeemer University Security at ext. 4444.

Who Does My Student Talk to in Times of Distress?

Students can find information about health, wellness and counselling resources on the Redeemer App. Qualified, professional Christian counsellors are available to students through Redeemer's partnership with the Christian Counselling Centre.

Students can also connect with the Student Life team. Particularly in times of distress, a resident student is able to immediately turn to their RA for support.

What Does My Student do if He/She becomes ill?

Students can book an appointment at the Student Health & Wellness Clinic on campus. The clinic is staffed by a nurse practitioner. Clinic staff can assist students with a variety of matters: minor injuries, illnesses (ie, fever, cough, abdominal pain, sore throat), wound care, feelings of depression or anxiety, medication renewals, immunizations, smoking cessation support, health education, resources for stress management, nutrition, activity, mental health support, and other topics. There are also local doctors and urgent care centres who are willing to see Redeemer students.

If you, as a parent, wish to receive information from Redeemer University about your student's academic or financial matters, your student must provide written consent to the Registrar's Office and the Students Accounts Office asking for such material to be made available to you. All communication regarding the student's grades or financial matters are given to the student.

Accessible Learning

My son/daughter had an IEP in high school? How can students register with Accessible Learning to inquire about academic accommodations.

At the University level it is very important that students request academic accommodations themselves. Students must:

1. Complete the Accessible Learning - Academic Accommodation Request Form which can be found within the new student portal or on the Learning Services page on the Redeemer App.
2. Submit current relevant documentation.
3. Meet with a Learning Services Staff member to discuss potential academic accommodations
