

WHAT IS THE YEAR ONE GUIDE?

This guide is designed to help you understand Redeemer's course structure and the process of choosing and registering for courses. Follow this booklet step-by-step so that you're prepared for your course registration appointment.

Book a course registration appointment at redeemer.ca/dashboard.

You'll be asked to log into your application portal to select an appointment time.

Most first-year students take 10 courses: 5 in the Fall term (September-December) and 5 in the Winter term (January-April).



Redeemer has a Core Curriculum — a set of 10 interdisciplinary courses that every student takes that provides context for all other courses you take at Redeemer, complements your major, and ultimately prepares you for your career and calling. In your first year, you will take 2 Core courses in the Fall and 2 in the Winter:



Next, you will add courses from your selected major and minor. Look through the following pages to see what courses are available to you in your first year, and what is suggested for your potential major/minor. Please note that you may only take 100-level (first-year) courses.



You may still have room to add a few extra courses — these are electives! Look through the course listings on the following pages and pick a few that interest you.

In your appointment, you will meet one-on-one with an academic advisor where your schedule will be established and alternate options may be recommended. Academic advisors are there to help you finalize a package of courses that will suit your future goals.
